

Vinish. G is a student having a rare talent. An art-Kathakalashepam (The Art of Story Telling)- that is


slowly getting into its sun-set days among students but

Subsequently, the first International Yoga Day was celebrated successfully on June 21, 2015 across the world including New York, Paris, Beijing, Bangkok, Kuala Lumpur, Seoul and New Delhi. Day on June 21, students and teachers of Satchidananda Jothi Nikethan International School, Kallar, Mettupalayam performed Hatha yoga with concentration amidst natural ambience in the school campus. The Secretary of the school, Dr.Kavidasan felicitated the event with his encouraging words and highlighted the importance of yoga. The students of Swami Vivekananda Study Circle showcased their knowledge



year for students to provide an experiential learning opportunity. For such a kind of learning by doing, we students of grade 9 went on a field trip to



Next, we arrived Bavanisagar dam by 2 o'clock. We were informed that the construction of this dam was started in 1948. It was completed by 1955 and opened for use in 1956. The main purpose of this dam is the supply of water to the agriculture, industries and for drinking purpose.
